
General meeting:

There were about 20 in attendance.



RAY PERSHING'S NOTES ON BUILDING THE MCR MOBILE HOME KITS:

I've built two of the preproduction kits so far, and I think that everyone will be very pleased. The kits just about fall together. Very minimal mold parting lines, except for the heavy gates on the propane tanks. These and the steps were really the only parts that required any significant cleanup work. I built two kits, one using ACC and one using quick setting liquid plastic cement, and found that I preferred the ACC because it set up the ends faster, making it easier to get the fit right.

I painted the entire model ATSF silver (although Model Master metalizer aluminum would have been cool, I didn't have any on hand), masked the doors and roof panel, then painted the base and contrasting trim colors. The horizontal highlights on the sides make masking this very easy. Finally, I went back with a 10/0 brush and did the window frames.

The chairs and table I had were incredibly fragile. They have gone back and beefed them up a little, but I haven't seen the new parts yet. I was able to work with the original chairs and table, but it took me a couple tries. The grill was very cool, and the antenna looks great!





SUSTAINING MEMBERS

MODELING TIP

(Compliments of Ted Wetterstroem)

To avoid wasting time crawling around on the floor, looking for a "launched" part (which you may NEVER find), try this: take an old hand towel and tape one end to the edge of your workbench, and tuck the other end into your belt (if you wear overalls, you're on your own).

DIVISION 10 OFFICER ELECTIONS

It's time for our first elections for officers for Division 10. We're almost a year old now. Officers are elected for two-year terms. Bob Richardson has chaired the nominations committee, but no nominations have been forthcoming. Our existing officers have all agreed to stand for election. Their sketches appear below, along with a ballot, which should be returned to Bob by September 15th.

For Superintendent: Fred Plymale has served for the past year as Superintendent in the pre-elections Division 10. He was the driving force behind re-instituting the Division, and has been tireless in all the efforts necessary to ensure a firm grounding. His plans for the next two years include recruiting of a broad pool of leadership for the Division, including future officers and board members, as well as committee chairs, expanding Division 10 activities, and strengthening cooperation between the NMRA and the other train-oriented groups in the Bluegrass area.

For Assistant Superintendent: Wendell Greer has served for the past year as Assistant Superintendent in the pre-elections Division 10. In addition, he has been actively involved in the Achievement Program, both as a participant and as an A.P. judge. His plans for the next two years include continued participation in the A.P. program and development of its judging staff, and coordination of shows. Wendell has completed all requirements for, and is soon to be awarded, a Master Model Railroader certificate, the only one in the Division as far as we know.

For Secretary: Pete Birdsong has served for the past year as Secretary in the pre-elections Division 10. Pete has also served as editor of our newsletter, *The Lantern*, and served on the Web Page committee, establishing a second site to include selections from *The Lantern* and a late-breaking updates feature on its home page. His plans for the future include expansion of the newsletter with additional features, and possibly forming an informal or formal Operations SIG with the objectives of rotating operations sessions and accrediting points towards the Chief Dispatcher Achievement Program award. He would also like to further communications about DCC within the Division.

For Treasurer: Mike Armstrong has served for the past year as Treasurer in the pre-elections Division 10, and has also chaired the Company Store and Estate Auctions committees. He is probably the most "cosmopolitan" member of the officer slate, involved in N, HO, O and G, and in outreach programs to youth. His plans for the future include involvement in shows, expansion of outreach activities, and generally lending his enthusiastic support for all of the Division 10 activities and initiatives, as well as continuation of the normal duties of Treasurer.



MEMBER PROFILES

Ray & Renee Grosser



Ray and Renee Grosser live at 1145 Linn Road, Eubank, Kentucky, just north of Somerset, off state highway 39.

Ray grew up at Glenwood, Minnesota on the Soo Line Railroad, where his dad was a brakeman for 47 years. He started modeling the Soo Line in 1951 when he was 11 with a railroad around the basement wall of the four apartment house building his parents rented. He operated and worked on the layout until 1957, when it was torn down due to loss of interest.

Ray went into the US Navy in 1958, and served with a Sea Bee Battalion on Okinawa. He returned to Minnesota in the early 1960s and went to the Alexandria Trade School to become a tool and die maker. There he built a 1-inch scale live steam Soo Line model locomotive and used it as his final exam. His grades out of that course have never been equaled due to the steam locomotive project, according to the school records.

Renee grew up on the Great Northern at Waite Park, Minnesota, where her father was a welding foreman and Carman for 42 years.

Ray and Renee decided to model their childhood memories and nostalgia on an 18 X 34 foot sectional portable model railroad after getting back into the hobby in 1990. Ray has constructed the yards, depot, roundhouse, and his boyhood home on one side, Renee has constructed a portion of the Great Northern car shops and repair buildings, as well as 5 of the 7 blocks of the street she lived, and where her parents still live in Waite Park.

Renee has constructed over 100 scratch built prototype buildings and over 120 auto-

Larry: Maybe not, Rivets, but you gotta stretch the prototype image somewhere, unless you're runnin' a real prototype. It's just a matter of where you want to stretch it, and what's the most fun for you. Meanwhile, I've got anxiety problems of my own.

Rivets: What's the matter, Larry?

Larry: I can't find my Walthers catalog, and it's makin' me feel so insecure!

Rivets: I'm gonna kill you one of these days, Larry...



