NMRA Achievement Program Explained!

Chief Dispatcher Certificate

Would you like to earn an AP certificate good toward your goal of Master Model Railroader just for playing with, I mean prototypically operating, your model railroad? Believe it or not you can with the Chief Dispatcher certificate. To earn this certificate you must "work" several of the operations roles that the real railroads use. These include Engineer, Yardmaster, Hostler, Towerman, and Dispatcher roles. The object is to run a model pike in a prototypical manner with mainline freights, local freights, and passenger trains, etc., all running in a realistic manner with meets and communications between trains and the dispatcher.

The categories, or work roles, are Engineer, Yardmaster, Hostler, Towerman, and Dispatcher. Lets look at each of these categories.

NMRA AP Explained (Continued from page 1)

The Engineer can be a freight or passenger train engineer. He runs the engine and does switching along his route as required. Starting and stopping in a prototypical manner.

The Yardmaster operates the switcher in a yard to build and break down trains. A subcategory of Yardmaster is Stationmaster who does the same thing except in a passenger yard, assembling and servicing passenger trains.

The Hostler runs the engine terminal. He assigns what motive power each train gets and runs the engines to and from the yards and engine terminal and services the locomotives.

The Towerman controls the turnouts along the main and sets the route a train will take based on a timetable or Dispatcher orders. The Towerman also notifies the Dispatcher when a train passes his tower or station. A subcategory in the Towerman category is Traffic Manager. The Traffic Manager determines what customers get what cars, when to pick them up, and what route they should take. This may be done by a computer switch list program or car card system.

The last and most important category is the Dispatcher. He is the "air traffic controller" of the railroad. He controls the main lines, who has access to it, how much of it, and when. A train can not move without the Dispatcher's permission.

Depending on the layout size that you are operating, some of these roles will not be used. For example if the layout does not have a large engine facility, a Hostler role may not be needed. However, to qualify you must work fifty hours with at least ten hours in three of the categories (roles), ten of the hours as dispatcher. Obviously you will need a record of the hours you operated and in which categories. This record needs to be "witnessed" by the AP chairman.

Every certificate requires documentation and Chief Dispatcher is no different. Four documents are required. First, a schematic drawing of a model railroad used to get some of your oper-

ating hours, and showing distances between towns. Second, a timetable appropriate for this model railroad, with at least eight scale hours in which three trains move in each direction. Third, draw an operating train chart (graph) which shows the scheduled train meets and position of each train with respect to time. Also, describe the action and movements required for a meet. Examples of a train chart can be found in various books on model railroad operations. Fourth, explain the system used to control car movements, train makeup, and operations in a prototypical manner. For example if you use car cards, describe how the card system works.

Members of the same layout operating group can use copies of the documentation that I previously mentioned for the model railroad schematic and description of the system used to control car movements and train make-up. Each member has to do his own timetable and train chart. Lastly, fill out a Statement of Qualification form and submit it all to me, AP chairman. So you see, you can get one certificate closer to earning you Master Model Railroader, just for playing trains! Oops, I meant prototypically operating a model railroad!


