NMRA Achievement Program Explained

So far in this column I have covered eight of the eleven Achievement Program categories. All the previously discussed categories dealt with modeling. However, the Achievement Program is not just about promoting improved modeling skills but also to promote the hobby in general and the NMRA in particular. To that end the remaining three categories pertain to service to the hobby and the NMRA. As you recall to achieve Master Model Railroader you must complete seven of the eleven categories. This month we will look at the Association Volunteer category.

Association Volunteer gives you credit for volunteering to chair committees, publish newsletters, judge contests, participate in NMRA sponsored events, and just about any other type of service to the club or the NMRA. Credits for these volunteer activities are recorded in certified Time Units (TUs). Each volunteer activity you complete has a certain number of TUs awarded for it.

*AP Explained (Continued from page 1)*

To qualify for the Association Volunteer you need to accumulate 60 TUs.

There are too many ways to earn TUs to cover them all in this column. But to give you a feel for some of the possibilities I will list a few. Committee chairman at the Division level is worth 1 TU per month, at the Regional level 2 TUs per month, and at the National level 3 TUs per month. A Division Officer is worth 1 TU per month. Participating as a Division committee member is worth ½ TU per month. You can also earn TUs for editing the clubs newsletter.

Newsletter editors earn the same number of TUs per month as a chairman would at a similar level. For example editing the Division's newsletter is worth 1 TU per month, Regional newsletter is worth 2 TUs. You can also earn credits by being a judge at a contest. Judging a Divisional contest is worth 1 TU, judging at a Regional contest is worth 2 TUs and judging at a National contest is worth 3 TUs. You would also get TUs if you were the chairman or committee member that organized the contest. The contests must be judged according to NMRA rules. Sorry, submitting a ballot for our monthly Bring and Brag contest does not qualify.

Another way to earn TUs is by hosting a layout tour as part of an NMRA function. Each time you open your layout up for an NMRA tour you earn 3 TUs per day. Also if you participate in a modular layout display at an NMRA sponsored event you can earn credits. Like layout tours you can earn 3 TUs per day, 3 TUs maximum for a Divisional event, 6 TUs maximum for a Regional event, and 12 TUs maximum for a National event. In addition you can earn credits for being a chairman or committee member that organizes the event.

If you are a Boy Scout Railroading Merit Badge Counselor you can earn 1 TU per month and 1 TU per Scout that earns the Merit Badge.

Of course to get credit for any of this you must keep records. The best way to do that is to get a Record Form from the NMRA web site and fill it out as

you accumulate credits. Each time you earn a credit for an activity, log it and have it witnessed at the time. It is much harder to fill out the form after a long period of time has past. Probably everyone in the club has earned some volunteer credits. So there is no time like the present to start recording your activities on the Record Form. For a more complete list of credited activities and the necessary forms see the national NMRA web site under the Achievement Program heading.


